CHINESE-IMMERSION PROGRAM

Emerson School is now accepting enrollments for its after-school Chinese language and culture program from students in first through eighth grades. Operating from 3:00 to 6:00 PM daily, the school year begins September 1.

Emerson's *Two-Worlds™ Approach* features intensive instruction in Chinese language and culture. The language curriculum focuses on both spoken and written language using simplified characters and pinyin. The cultural curriculum includes modern and traditional history, philosophy, art, crafts, architecture, music, and dance, as well as modern cuisine, manners, and physical exercise. Students are grouped by language ability in multi-age groupings. All teachers are fluent in Mandarin. The student-teacher ratio does not exceed 12:1.



Though it is not required, enrollment in the Chinese-immersion program may be combined with enrollment in Emerson School (8:00-3:00 PM). The joint curriculum provides a rich, bilingual-bicultural experience that prepares students to succeed in two worlds, American and Chinese, while respecting the important and enduring differences between the two.
